

# Sheriff's Report

April 13, 2018

Randolph County Sheriff Mark Nichols reports the following incidents, reports, investigations and arrests.

On April 2<sup>nd</sup>, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 2700 block of Highway JJ in reference to a report of trespass. The complainant reported that the property in question was a rental property and the suspects were not on the lease agreement. Contact was made with the suspects and advised that they were trespassing and needed to vacate the premises. The suspects immediately departed the residence.

On April 6<sup>th</sup> at 7:23 pm, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 1600 block of County Road 1120 in reference to a domestic disturbance. The complainant reported that her ex-boyfriend threw her iPhone on the ground and took the ignition key for her vehicle. The suspect departed the area prior to the arrival of the deputy. The deputy searched for the suspect to no avail. The suspect is still being sought for questioning.

On April 8<sup>th</sup>, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 200 block of Grand street in Higbee in reference to a suspicious person. The complainant reported that an individual was in the vacant residence near their home. The deputy responded to the residence and located a subject. The individual advised that his father owns the residence and he was there changing locks. No further action taken.

On April 9<sup>th</sup>, at 5:58 pm, a deputy was dispatched to the area of Highways A and B in reference to cattle on the highway. The deputy patrolled the area without locating any cattle out of confinement.

On April 10<sup>th</sup>, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 1600 block of County Road 2350 in reference to a stolen vehicle. The complainant reported that a 2001 black Ford Expedition was removed from his property. The investigation continues.

On April 11<sup>th</sup> at 12:41 pm, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 2300 block of County Road 2347 in reference to an individual operating a 4-wheeler on the roadway. The deputy located the individual and warned him about his actions.

On April 12<sup>th</sup> at 4:41 am, a deputy was dispatched to a residence on County Road 2010 in reference to an alarm sounding. Upon arrival the deputy located an unsecure door. A key-holder responded and the area was searched, finding nothing disturbed.

On April 6<sup>th</sup>, Michael James Bass, 25 of rural Clark was served a Randolph County warrant for failure to appear on three counts of a class D felony charge of forgery. Bond set at \$25,000 cash only. Bass remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On April 6<sup>th</sup>, James Ray Fainter Jr., 36 of Renick was served a Randolph County warrant on a class D felony charge of assault – 3<sup>rd</sup> degree – special victim. Bond set at \$20,000 cash only. Fainter remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On April 9<sup>th</sup>, William Gregory Tolson, 59 of Columbia was served two Randolph County warrants. Warrant one for failure to appear on an infraction of driver/front seat passenger failed to wear properly adjusted/fastened safety belt. Bond set at \$25 cash only. Warrant two for failure to appear on an unclassified misdemeanor charge of owner operated motor vehicle without maintaining financial responsibility – 2<sup>nd</sup>/subsequent offense. Bond set at \$150 cash only. Tolson posted the required bond and released.

On April 9<sup>th</sup>, Aaron Wesley Hess, 53 of Moberly was served two Randolph County warrants. Warrant one for failure to appear on a class C misdemeanor charge of negligent burning or exploding. Bond set at \$200 cash only. Warrant two for failure to appear on a class B misdemeanor charge of property damage – 2<sup>nd</sup> degree. Bond set at \$100 cash only. Hess posted the required bond and released.

On April 9<sup>th</sup>, Nailah Shere Moore, 39 of Columbia was served a Randolph County warrant for failure to appear on an infraction of failure to transfer plates of vehicle within 30 days. Bond set at \$500 cash only. Moore posted the required bond and released.

On April 9<sup>th</sup>, Kevyn Christopher Koschak, 25 of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant on a class D felony charge of domestic assault – 2<sup>nd</sup> degree. Bond set at \$10,000 cash or surety. Koschak posted the required bond and released.

On April 9<sup>th</sup>, Ryan Lee Windsor, 20 of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant on a class B misdemeanor charge of driving while intoxicated. Bond set at \$2,000 cash or surety. Windsor posted the required bond and released.

On April 9<sup>th</sup>, Fred Lee Robinson, 35 of Friars Point, Mississippi was served a Randolph County warrant for a probation violation on a class C felony charge of possession of a controlled substance except 35 grams or less of Marijuana. No bond was set. Robinson remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On April 9<sup>th</sup>, Bryson David Glenn Pindell, 21 of Moberly was served two Randolph County warrants. Warrant one for failure to appear on a class D felony charge of delivery or possession of a controlled substance at county/private jail/correctional center except with written prescription. Bond set at \$10,000 cash only. Warrant two for failure to appear on two class D felony charges of possession of a controlled substance except 35 grams or less of Marijuana/Synthetic Cannabinoid. Bond set at \$10,000 cash only. Pindell remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On April 9<sup>th</sup>, Christopher Shawn Bowers, 41 of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant for failure to appear on an unclassified misdemeanor charge of driving while revoked/suspended – 1<sup>st</sup> offense. Bond set at \$150 cash only. Bowers was released on his own recognizance by the court.

On April 9<sup>th</sup>, Samuel A. Berry, 34 of Moberly was served three Randolph County warrants. Warrant one for probation violation on a class D felony charge of driving while revoked/suspended. No bond set. Warrant two for a probation violation on a class D felony charge of driving while revoked/suspended. Bond set at \$20,000 Cash only. Warrant three for a probation violation on a class C felony charge of domestic assault – 2<sup>nd</sup> degree – prior domestic violence offender and a class C felony charge of tampering with a motor vehicle – 1<sup>st</sup> degree. No bond set. Berry remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On April 9<sup>th</sup>, Lisa Dawn White (Glydewell) (Wilson), 44 of Huntsville was served a Randolph County warrant on a class D felony charge of possession of a controlled substance except 35 grams or less of Marijuana/Synthetic Cannabinoid. Bond set at \$10,000 cash or surety. White (Glydewell) (Wilson) posted the required bond and released.

On April 9<sup>th</sup>, Gregory T. Crites, 41 of Huntsville was served a Randolph County warrant for failure to appear on a class A misdemeanor charge of non-support. Bond set at \$2,000 cash only. Crites was released on his own recognizance by the court.

On April 9<sup>th</sup>, Timothy Reid Zike, 60 of Higbee was served a Randolph County warrant on a class D felony charge of possession of a controlled substance except 35 grams or less of Marijuana/Synthetic Cannabinoid. Bond Set at \$5,000 surety – 10% cash allowed. Zike posted the required bond and released.

On April 10<sup>th</sup>, Corey Allen Davis, 29 of Salisbury was served a Randolph County warrant on a class D felony charge of possession of a controlled substance except 35 grams or less of Marijuana/Synthetic Cannabinoid. Bond set at \$45,000 cash or surety. Davis remains incarcerated.

On April 11<sup>th</sup>, Danny Allen Washam, 52 of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant on three unclassified felony charges of statutory rape or attempted statutory rape – 1<sup>st</sup> degree – with person less than 12 years of age, a class B felony charge of child molestation – 2<sup>nd</sup> degree – with child less than 12 years of age, four class D felony charges of endangering the welfare of a child – creating a substantial risk – 1<sup>st</sup> degree – 1<sup>st</sup> offense – sexual contact, four class E felony charges of incest, an unclassified felony charge of statutory sodomy or attempted statutory sodomy – deviate sexual intercourse – with person less than 14 years of age, three class A felony charges of child molestation – 1<sup>st</sup> degree and an unclassified felony charge of enticement or attempted enticement of a child (actor 21 years of age or older and child less than 15 years of age). Bond set at \$250,000 cash only. Washam remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On April 11<sup>th</sup>, Daniel Lee Hill, 33 of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant on a class D felony charge of possession of a controlled substance except 35 grams or less of Marijuana/Synthetic Cannabinoid. Bond set at \$5,000 cash or surety. Hill remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On April 11<sup>th</sup>, Scott Arthur Ostrander, 39 of Columbia was served a Randolph County warrant for a probation violation on a class D felony charge of theft/stealing – of property or services of \$500 or more but less than \$25,000. Bond set at \$20,000 cash only. Ostrander remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On April 12<sup>th</sup>, Carla Renee Walstead a/k/a Carla R. Dougherty, 39 of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant for failure to appear on a class A misdemeanor charge of non-support. Bond set at \$2,500 cash only. Walstead remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On April 13<sup>th</sup>, Kaden Elija Lockwood, 20 of St. Louis was served a Randolph County warrant for failure to appear on a class A misdemeanor charge of receiving stolen property. Bond set at \$500 cash only. Lockwood remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On April 13<sup>th</sup>, Paul M. Goldsmith, 40 of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant on a class A misdemeanor charge of domestic assault – 4<sup>th</sup> degree – 1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup> offense and a class A misdemeanor charge of resisting or interfering with arrest/detention/stop. Bond set at \$2,500 cash or surety. Goldsmith remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.
