

Sheriff's Report

May 10, 2018

Randolph County Sheriff Mark Nichols reports the following incidents, reports, investigations and arrests.

On May 4th, while traveling in the 400 block of North Main Street in Huntsville, a deputy observed a vehicle being operated with expired registration. The deputy initiated a traffic stop and identified the operator. The deputy learned that the license of the driver was suspended. The driver was arrested and transported to the Randolph County Jail.

On May 4th, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 300 block of W. Sheldon in reference to a dog bite. The complainants reported that they were walking in the street when a dog left its property and attacked them. The dog bit one of the victims on the arm and tore the second victim's pants. The owner was advised to quarantine the animal for a 10-day observation period. A copy of the report has been forwarded to the Randolph County Health Department.

On May 4th, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 300 block of Davis Street in reference to a loose pig. The complainant reported that the pig was attempting to enter her residence. A passerby advised the deputy of the owner. The deputy walked the pig home and secured it in its pen.

On May 5th, a deputy was dispatched to a location Highway 3 South in reference to providing traffic control at the scene of a motor vehicle fire. The deputy remained on scene until the fire was extinguished and area cleared.

On May 5th, a deputy was dispatched to a building in the 300 block of Bradley Street in Higbee in reference to a report of property damage. The complainant directed the deputy to a broken window to the building and a shattered windshield of a vehicle that was parked at the building. Photographs were taken of the damage. The investigation continues.

On May 5th, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 8000 block of west Highway 24 in reference to a domestic disturbance. Upon arrival the complainant reported that he and his wife had been involved in a verbal argument. The wife had departed prior to the arrival of the deputy. The deputy suggested that the two, stay separated over night to allow the situation to cool. The complainant agreed.

On May 6th, Moberly Police Officers were pursuing a vehicle that was refusing to yield. The vehicle traveled into the County and MPD requested deputies to respond and search for the vehicle. A deputy located the suspect vehicle, abandoned, on County Road 2270. Deputies and officers searched for the suspect to no avail. A short time later, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 3300 block of Highway JJ in reference to a stolen vehicle. The vehicle matched the description of the one in the pursuit. The investigation continues.

On May 6th, a deputy contacted a rural Moberly resident, concerning a report of trespass. The complainant advised that he had an image from a trail camera of a young individual who was walking on his property. The complainant is to forward the photos so that deputies can attempt to identify and locate the suspect.

On May 6th, a deputy was dispatched to a location on County Road 2130 in reference to horses on the county road. The deputy patrolled the area without locating any horses out of confinement.

On May 7th, a deputy met with a rural Moberly resident in referenced to receiving threatening text messages. The deputy has received copies of the threats. Due to the suspect being in another state, the authorities in that jurisdiction will be notified.

On May 8th, a deputy with the assistance of the Missouri State Highway Patrol, responded to a disturbance in the 6500 block of Highway B in Higbee. Upon arrival, the officers found no one at the residence. A female approached the officers from a pasture and inquired about the visit. The deputy advised of the complaint. The female subject advised that she and her boyfriend had gotten into a verbal argument and she left the residence on foot. Officers searched for the boyfriend to no avail.

On May 4th, Kobie Lee Hall of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant for a probation violation on a class C felony charge of assault – 2nd degree. Bond set at \$500 cash only. Hall posted the required bond and released.

On May 7th, Joshua Ashton Perry of Columbia was served a Randolph County – City of Clark warrant on an ordinance violation of exceeded he posted speed limit – 11 to 15 miles per hour. Bond set at \$125 cash only. Perry posted the required bond and released.

On May 7th, Anita Lynn Alexander of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant for failure to appear on a class A misdemeanor charge of passing bad checks – less than \$500. Bond set at \$450 cash only. Alexander remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On May 7th, Donald Fay Fuller III of Macon was served a Randolph County warrant on a class E felony charge of leaving the scene of an accident – property damage exceeding \$1000 and a

class E felony charge of driving while revoked/suspended. Bond set at \$10,000 cash or surety. Fuller posted the required bond and released.

On May 7th, Shon Kevin Diegan of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant for a class D felony charge of possession of a controlled substance except 35 grams or less of Marijuana/Synthetic Cannabinoid. Bond set at \$10,000 cash or surety. Diegan posted the required bond and released.

On May 7th, Angelica Nichole White of Columbia was served two Randolph County warrants for failure to appear on an unclassified misdemeanor charge of operate vehicle on highway without a valid license, a class C misdemeanor charge of exceeded the posted speed limit by 11 to 15 miles per hour and an unclassified misdemeanor charge of owner operated motor vehicle without maintaining financial responsibility or operator who authorized another to operate motor vehicle without financial responsibility. Bonds set at \$300 cash only and \$500 cash only. White posted the required bond and released.

On May 7th, Miranda Mae Reffett of rural Higbee was served two Randolph County warrants. Warrant one on a class D felony charge of possession of a controlled substance except 35 grams or less of Marijuana/Synthetic Cannabinoid. Bond set at \$10,000 cash or surety. Warrant two on a class E felony charge of hindering prosecution of a felony. Bond set at \$5,000 cash or surety. Reffett posted the required bond and released.

On May 7th, Jacob Leonard Beal of rural Higbee was served a Randolph County warrant on a class D felony charge of assault – 2nd degree. Bond set at \$10,000 cash only. Beal received a bond reduction and posted the reduced bond and was released.

On May 7th, Dustin Eugene Burton of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant on a class E felony charge of harassment – 1st degree. Bond set at \$10,000 cash only. Burton remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On May 7th, George Wake Bell II of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant on a class B felony charge of burglary – 1st degree. Bond set at \$10,000 cash only. Bell remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On May 7th, Anthony Dean Roberts of Marceline was served a Randolph County warrant on a class C felony charge of driving while intoxicated – chronic offender and a class E felony charge of driving while revoked/suspended. Bond set at \$20,000 cash only. Roberts remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On May 7th, Timothy Shane Moore of Cairo was served a Randolph County warrant on a probation violation on two class C felony charges of burglary – 2nd degree. Bond set at \$2,000 cash only. Moore posted the required bond and released.

On May 7th, John Steven Conley of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant on a class D felony charge of domestic assault – 2nd degree. Bond set at \$10,000 cash or surety. Conley posted the required bond and released.

On May 7th, Tyler Wayne Kelsey of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant on a class D felony charge of possession of a controlled substance except 35 grams or less of Marijuana/Synthetic Cannabinoid. Bond set at \$2,500 cash or surety – 10% cash allowed. Kelsey posted the required bond and released.

On May 7th, Anthony Edward Nash of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant on a class D felony charge of possession of a controlled substance except 35 grams or less of Marijuana/Synthetic Cannabinoid. Bond set at \$15,000 cash only. Nash was released on his own recognizance by the court.

On May 9th, Cory Andrew Jolliffe of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant for a probation violation on a class D felony charge of driving while intoxicated – alcohol – persistent offender and an unclassified misdemeanor charge of driving while revoked/suspended. Bond set at \$2,500 cash or surety. Jolliffe posted the required bond and released.
