Sheriff's Report

January 5, 2018

Randolph County Sheriff Mark Nichols reports the following incidents, reports, investigations and arrests.

On December 29th at 10:22 a.m., while patrolling near Highways 22 and 63, a deputy observed a vehicle being operated that the registration had been expired since October. The deputy initiated a traffic stop and identified the driver. The driver was issued a summons for failure to register a motor vehicle.

On December 30th at 9:28 a.m., deputies were dispatched to a residence in the 3300 block of County Road 2250 in reference to a domestic assault. Through the investigation, witness accounts and injuries received by one of the parties. The female subject was arrested for domestic assault and transported to the Randolph County Jail. The report has been forwarded to the Randolph County Prosecuting Attorney for review and formal action.

On January 3rd and 5:55 a.m., a deputy was dispatched to the 11000 block of West Highway 24 in reference to a structure fire. The deputy provided traffic control until the fire was extinguished and his services were no longer needed.

On January 4th, 41-year old Moberly resident, Manda Celeste Collier was served a Randolph County warrant for a probation violation on a class D felony charge of possession of a controlled substance except 35 grams or less of Marijuana/Synthetic Cannabinoid. Bond set at \$25,000 cash only. Collier remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.
