

Sheriff's Report

January 19, 2018

Randolph County Sheriff Mark Nichols reports the following incidents, reports, investigations and arrests.

On January 12th at 11:35 am, deputies responded to a residence in the 3300 block of County Road 2250 in reference to a domestic disturbance. Upon arrival, deputies met with the victim who reported that she and her brother were involved in a verbal argument when it escalated and the brother pushed his sister causing her to receive a scratch to her face. The victim had an injury consistent with her claim. The suspect was interviewed, arrested and transported to the Randolph County Jail.

On January 13th at 9:00 am, a deputy received a report of a stolen vehicle from a Centralia resident. The complainant reported that he had been incarcerated for several years and that the vehicle in question was taken from a property in Jacksonville. The complainant provided the name of a possible suspect. The investigation continues.

On January 13th at 5:33 pm, a deputy responded to a residence in the 1600 block of County Road 1120 in reference to assisting the Division of Family Services with a hotline investigation. All parties were contacted and interviewed.

On January 14th at 5:01 pm, a deputy was dispatched to Highway 63 north of Moberly in reference to a stolen semi-truck from a local trucking company. The truck was located and the deputy initiated a traffic stop. The driver was ordered out of the truck. The driver exited the truck and began running north on Highway 63. After a short pursuit, the subject was apprehended. The suspect was transported to the Randolph County Jail.

On January 15th at 12:42 am, a deputy learned the whereabouts of an individual who had an outstanding warrant. Officers responded to the residence in the 600 block of West Depot in Huntsville. The subject was located at the residence and arrested. Upon searching the subject, a small baggie of a controlled substance was located. The subject was transported to the Randolph County Jail.

On January 15th at 4:55 am, a deputy assisted Huntsville Police with a keep the peace at a residence in the 400 block of South Main Street. The requesting party gathered personal property at the residence without incident. No further action taken.

On January 15th at 5:57 pm, a deputy was dispatched to a location on County Road 1310 to assist the Missouri State Highway Patrol with traffic control at the scene of a motor vehicle accident. The deputy remained on scene until the investigation was complete and area cleared.

On January 15th at 9:00 pm, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 6800 block of Highway C in reference to a burglary. The complainant reported that someone entered his residence and outbuilding and stole a 220-volt welder, a 110-volt wire fed welder, an automatic darkening welding helmet, a 1" belt sander, a 6" bench vise, a 54" flat screen television, a tv wall bracket, 2 – 3/8-inch electric drills, Buffalo brand and a ¼-inch Buffalo brand electric drill. The investigation continues.

On January 15th a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 2200 block of Highway JJ in reference to a domestic disturbance. Upon arrival the deputy met with two subjects. The female subject advised that they had been involved in a verbal argument. Both parties had calmed down prior to the arrival of the deputy. No further action taken.

On January 16th at 5:27 pm, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 2700 block of Highway JJ in reference to keeping the peace while one party removed personal items from the property. The property was gathered without incident. No further action taken.

On January 16th at 5:42 pm, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 100 block of Rice Street in Clark in reference to keeping the peace while one party removed personal items from the property. The property was gathered without incident. No further action taken.

On January 17th, at 7:18 pm, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 1100 block of County Road 2112 in reference to a suspicious person at the complainant's residence. The complainant reported that when he and his family returned to their residence, they observed an unfamiliar female on their front porch. The deputy made contact with the subject and learned that she was a juvenile who ran away from her residence after getting into a verbal argument with her mother. The juvenile was transported to the Moberly Police Department where she was turned over to the authority of the Randolph County Juvenile Office.

On January 15th, William Dallas Stufflebean was served a Randolph County warrant on a class E felony charge of unlawful use of a weapon. Bond set at \$10,000 cash only. Stufflebean remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On January 16th, 25-year old Lacy Leann Landreth of Madison was served four Randolph County warrants. Warrant one for failure to appear on a class C misdemeanor charge of exceeded the posted speed limit by 11 to 15 miles per hour. Bond set at \$200 cash only. Warrant two for failure to appear on a class A misdemeanor charge of stealing leased or rented property. Bond set at \$500 cash only. Warrant three for failure to appear on a class A misdemeanor charge of

stealing leased or rented property. Bond set at \$500 cash only. Warrant four for failure to appear on a class A misdemeanor charge of stealing leased or rented property. Bond set at \$750 cash only. Landreth was sentenced to 2-years-probation by the court and released.

On January 16th, 28-year old Zachary Steven Ruffel of Clark was served a Randolph County warrant on a class D felony charge of abuse or neglect of a child and a class D felony charge of endangering the welfare of a child, creating a substantial risk – 1st degree – 1st offense. Bond set at \$20,000 cash only. Ruffel posted the required bond and released.

On January 16th, 35-year old Gary Lee Forester of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant on two class D felony charges of forgery. Bond set at \$2,000 cash or Surety. Forester posted the required bond and released.

On January 17th, 37-year old Brad Christmann of Jefferson City was served a Randolph County warrant for failure to appear on a class E felony charge of pass bad check. Bond set at \$5000 cash or surety. Christmann was released to Moniteau County authorities to face charges in their jurisdiction.

21-year old Brandon Lee Garven of rural Moberly was served two Randolph County warrants. Warrant one for failure to appear on an infraction of driver/front seat passenger failed to wear properly adjusted/fastened safety belt. Bond set at \$100 cash only. Warrant two for failure to appear on an infraction of driver/front seat passenger failed to wear properly adjusted/fastened safety belt. Bond set at \$100 cash only. Garven posted the required bond and released.

On January 17th, 19-year old Demetrius Terrill Young of Moberly was served two Randolph County warrants. Warrant one on an unclassified felony charge of fugitive from out of state. Bond set at \$20,000 cash only. Warrant two on a class A misdemeanor charge of operate a motor vehicle on highway without a valid license – 2nd offense and a class A misdemeanor charge of possession of Marijuana/Synthetic Cannabinoid of 10 grams or less – prior drug offense. Bond set at \$2,000 cash only. Young remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On January 17th, 35-year old Christopher J. Link of Hannibal was served a Randolph County warrant for failure to appear on two class C felony charges of domestic assault – 2nd degree. Bond set at \$7,500 cash only. Link remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On January 17th, 24-year old Stephen Milton Ketchem was served a Randolph County warrant on a class D felony charge of burglary – 2nd degree. Bond set at \$100,000 cash only. Ketchem remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On January 17th, 30-year old Alan Eugene Miller of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant for failure to obey a judge's order on a class E felony charge of domestic assault – 4th degree – 3rd or subsequent offense. Bond set at \$20,000. Miller remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On January 17th, 20-year old Tyra Renee Coleman of Kansas City was served a Randolph County warrant on a class E felony charge of 35 grams or less of Marijuana or Synthetic Cannabinoid. Bond set at \$50,000 cash only. Coleman remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On January 18th, 30-year old Ricky Lamar Morgan Jr. of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant on two class C felony charges of delivery of a controlled substance except 35 grams or less of Marijuana or Synthetic Cannabinoid, a class E felony charge of delivery of 35 grams or less of Marijuana or Synthetic Cannabinoid and a class E felony charge of unlawful use of a weapon – possession of a weapon and a felony controlled substance. Bond set at \$100,000 cash only. Morgan remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.
